1 RULES

The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2 ENTRIES

Competitors may enter by completing an entry form and paying the entry fee before 1130 on Saturday, 19 June.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the Pavilion. Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 1100 on Saturday and 0800 on Sunday.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the docked Signal boat. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 45 minutes after flag AP is lowered. This changes Race Signals AP.

5 SCHEDULE AND CLASS FLAG

A competitors' meeting will be held at 1130 on Saturday at the Pavilion. The warning signal for the first race will be at 1300 on Saturday; and 1000 on Sunday. Five races are scheduled (3 on Saturday, 2 on Sunday, depending on fair weather conditions). No races will start after 1300 on Sunday. Class flag is white with a dark Flying Scot logo.

6 RACING AREA

The racing area will be at the mouth of the South River. The particulars of the intended location will be discussed at the competitor's meeting. The Signal boat will display flag L while moving to the starting area and recording the check-in. (Note: The L Flag will be lowered 1 minute prior to the beginning of the start sequence)

7 CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT

Prior to the Warning Signal for the first race each day, each boat shall sail past the Signal Boat, hail her sail number, and be acknowledged by the Race Committee. Only the Race Committee may protest an alleged breach of this rule. The penalty for a first offense shall be a warning. This changes RRS 60.1 and 60.3. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

8 COURSE AND MARKS

The course will be Windward-Leeward. The attached diagram shows the course, the marks in order, and the rounding direction of each mark. Marks "A" and "C" will be yellow tetrahedrons, offset mark "B" will be an orange ball. The course may be shortened at the end of the third or fourth leg per RRS 32. The course may be adjusted during racing for distance and/or wind direction.

9 STARTING AND FINISHING LINES

The starting line will be between Mark C, a yellow tetrahedron, and a yellow "RC" flag on the signal boat. The finishing line will be between mark "A" and a yellow flag on the finish boat. A blue "RC" flag will signal "this boat is in position at the finishing line." This changes Race Signals Blue flag.

10 TIME LIMITS

Time limit for the first boat to sail the course will be two hours. Time limit for subsequent boats is 30 minutes after the first boat finishes. The blue flag on the RC Finish boat will be lowered with one long sound when the 30 minute period expires. Boats still racing 30 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired - the number of boats that finished within their time limit plus one point) and should proceed to the starting area if another race is scheduled for that day. This changes RRS 35, A4.2 and A11.


11 PROTESTS

Protest time limit is 45 minutes after the signal boat returns to the dock. The same protest time limit applies to all protests by the race committee; this changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2. Protest forms are available from the official notice board. Protests shall be delivered to the Principal Race Officer within the protest time limit. Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held on the docked signal boat as soon as possible.

12 SCORING

All scores will count. This changes RRS A2. One race constitutes a series.

GENERAL COURSE DESCRIPTION: WINDWARD – LEEWARD: FIVE LEGS

Starting Line – Between mark 'PIN' and START boat
First Leg – from Starting Line to mark 'A'
Second Leg – from mark 'A' to mark 'B'
Third Leg – from mark 'B' to mark 'A'
Fourth Leg – from mark 'A' to mark 'B'
Fifth Leg – from mark 'B' to Finishing Line
Finishing Line – Between mark 'A' and FINISH boat

Boats shall leave each mark on the Port side.
