So you wacked a rock with your center board too? Epoxy putty cures the dent and makes it like new. Use masking tape to keep it from sagging while it sets up.

Back trouble? A national retail - mail order house has a great combination front wheel - jack for trailers that really takes off the strain.

WHY AND HOW ONE-DESIGN RACING FLEETS ARE FORMED

Here's one fleet's interesting and logical reasons to this question that seems to interest so many of the racing minded new sailors, as written by Mrs. Linda Rich, Corresponding Secretary of the fast growing FLYING SCOT Fleet #46, which sails out of Middle Bay on the South Shore of Long Island, New York.

"A few years ago we began our racing club with a small number of boats who raced informally on Middle Bay every week-end during the sailing season. This proved a bit too informal as we became more capable, so handicap races were initiated, with a beautiful spread - from a Narraskatuck which my husband, Bob, and I owned at the time, to a 28-foot trimaran. This, in turn, tended to whet our appetites for strictly one-design racing, and since one of our club members was consistently whizzing past the rest of the fleet, eight members each purchased a boat of this same Class next season, including the Riches. Our new one-design fleet, with Bob as Fleet Captain, was intact for one entire season, but individuals began to sell the following summer.

Several factors contributed in reducing the fleet from eight to two boats after a single racing season, principally the 15-20 mile average winds, often with gusts quite a bit higher. The Class we had chosen was a relatively light center boarder with a fairly large amount of sail, and we found we needed, for crew, people who really knew what they were doing. Although we loved this one-design boat, getting capable crew each week-end, an essential requirement, became increasingly difficult. But we all had become hooked on one-design racing, and we had no desire to the handicap variety.

Investigating carefully to locate a boat that would most nearly meet all of our fleet requirements, the first FLYING SCOT was purchased early last summer. This created enough enthusiasm to spur not only the original eight skippers, but a total of thirteen SCOTS to be added during 1964, with an increase anticipated by the start of our 1965 racing season. The main thing that sells us on our own SCOT is the fact that we don't have to worry about taking extra crew with us - the two of us sail it alone or one of us can day-sail it by ourselves if we so desire. It has proven to be ideal with our area where we have a problem with the amount of water - there just isn't much of it in Middle Bay and at high tide the water rises to about 6-feet. We had the SCOT out in late November last year when the gusts were about 30 and she handled beautifully.

With an extremely avid group of racing skippers, the fleet has set up an active schedule for the Summer of 1965, from May through October, with most races held on Sundays. The entire schedule is set up for 21 races, not including the regattas we plan to attend at nearby Yacht Clubs.

The Race Committee comfortably resides aloft an old houseboat which was purchased by the Hemstead Bay Sailing Club, with which the FLYING SCOT Fleet #46 is affiliated, and from which all club races are run. Although somewhat of an antique, the houseboat was caulked, hammered and painted into shape by several hard working members, and has served as a convenient spot to relax after the races and tie up the boat for a swim or picnic lunch.

FLEET #7

The Executive Committee has voted to continue the practice of recent years of racing for Fleet trophies only on Sunday in connection with the Yacht Racing Association East of Rye Regatta. Anyone who wishes to race on Saturday will be more than welcome and will be given a start at the normal time by the particular race committee involved.

There is however one very important change in our racing schedule for this year. In the past you will recall we had two series of ten races each. This year we are going to have three series, the first two of which involve seven races each and the third six races. In order to qualify for a series you must enter fifty percent of the races for such series. This means four races in each of the first two series and three in the last.

The reasons for the three series stem from the desire to create more competition. We think that those who take extended vacations will have a good chance at some silverware in at least two of the three series, whereas last year they might have been limited to one or none, depending on their timing. We also think this will result in more prizes spread over more people. For those who were concerned that too few races permit qualification, you will note that this year's twenty races require eleven for full qualification, whereas in the past ten have sufficed.

Furhter, you will note that our Fleet, with the cooperation of the Riverside Yacht Club and its Race Committee, will be hosts to the North Eastern District Championships on August 6th, 7th and 8th. The three races will be sailed on August 6th and 7th, if possible, but we must leave August 8th available for a makeup and thus cannot schedule a regular Fleet race that day.

The Mid-Winter Regatta held at the Houston Yacht Club on the northwest shore of Galveston Bay attracted at least ten Flying Scots, two of which were Bill and Harris Garrett in their "Mollie Jane" (267) and Fred and Rick Tears in the "Lissa T." (553) from Fleet #23. H. G. Henderson, formerly of Abilene and now of Houston, and Dick Elam (380) of Abilene also raced and helped to add excitement in all the three races sailed. The weekend of February 20th and 21st was one of the best of the winter and no "blue norther" blasted the blue-green water of the Bay. In fact, the first race was sailed in 5-10 knot breezes on Saturday with similar conditions prevailing in the third race held Sunday. Fred Tears showed the salt-water skippers how the inland lakes are good training grounds and won both the first race and the third to win the series! Dick Elam won a very close finish in the 2nd race just ahead of the Garretts. By amazing coincidence Tears, Garrett, Elam and Henderson were all tied in total points at the end of the second race for first place in the standings. None of the Scots in Fleet #32 used spinnakers and as a result the sailors from

Galveston Bay had their own competition with a split fleet some distance behind the group of the first four boats. Fred Tears showed his stern to the rest of the fleet in the last race and the next three places were taken by Dick Elam, Pat Henderson and Harris Garrett (1963 National Champion) who believes the 70-degree clear weather and light winds set her thoughts to another summer sailing on Nantucket Sound where "smoky sou" westers" make the sailing quite different but nonetheless most enjoyable.

May 1st and 2nd marks the placement of a new stepping stone for our fleet's activities and progress. A hurried planning committee decided on making invitations to all the Flying Scot fleets from #49 at Lake Granite Shoals, Texas, on the west, to Fleet 32 on the south, at Galveston Bay, to Nos. 38 and 45 at Mobile and Jackson, respectively, in the southeast, to take advantage of an open racing date on White Rock Lake when no space was available for Scots at the Shreveport, La., regatta. The late notice doubtless had an adverse effect on attendance from the more distant fleets but our good friends Mr. and Mrs. John C. Batte and Dr. and Mrs. Ben Banahan brought their boats over the 460 mile trip from Jackson, Mississippi, and the Dick Elam family from Abilene, Texas trailered in from 200 miles away to add to the competition. Strong winds both days tended to limit some of the local fleet skippers as to participation.

The final standings were as follows: Dick Elam, 35 pts. 1st; Harris Garrett, 43 pts. 2nd; Kil Adams, 47 pts. 3rd; Ed Eldredge, 47 pts. 4th; David Steere, 55 pts. 5th; and Dr. Jack Woolf, 67 pts. 6th.

FLEET #38

On April 24, 1965 the Seventh Annual Long Distance Yacht Race was held by the Mobile Bay-Dauphin Island Racing Association. This Race was hosted by the Fairhope Yacht Club, (Alabama) and sailed from Fairhope to Dauphin Island at the entrance of Mobile Bay, a distance of 20 miles, as the crow flies, if the crow flew in a straight line. On the following day, April 25, the Homeward Bound race was held, back to the Fairhope Yacht Club, with both races being run in 15 to 20 mile winds from the SSW. with gusts up to 25 m.p.h. The result--the fastest race in the history of this event.

A total of 114 boats participated in the race with only 6 DNF's, and the following classes were represented: Fish, Star, Rhodes 19, Lightning, Flying Scot, Rhodes Ranger, Osprey, Ensign, Windmill, C.C.A. rated Yachts, Handicap 1-Displacement, and Handicap 2-Planing or centerboard.

There were 9 Flying Scots on the starting line and they finished as follows, with the winning boat completing the distance in 3:23:30, and with only 00:08:46 between the first four boats. Unfortunately the committee was unable to take the times of the remaining five due to the fact that boats of all types were crossing the line too rapidly:

The Homeward Bound Race was a down hill, reach, run, reach race for the entire 20 miles, with spinnakers all the way. Only 54 boats participated, running back to Fairhope Yacht Club, the remainder going to Mobile and Buccaneer Yacht Clubs on the other side of the Bay or withdrawing because of other committments.

There were five Flying Scots in this race and the first of these finished in 2:54:15 with only 00:04:03 between the first four boats. The order of finish was as follows:
